50th Anniversary Medal Information

A LIMITED EDITION COMMEMORATIVE

The North York Coin Club is commemorating its 50th anniversary in 2010. Several special initiatives and events have been organized to mark this milestone, one of which is a proposed commemorative medal. The club's earliest endeavour was the striking of a founding medal. It is, therefore, most appropriate that a special commemorative medal should be struck upon its 50th anniversary.

The North York Coin Club 50th anniversary medal is being issued in a very limited mintage of 100 medals. It is sure to become a collector's item!

This commemorative medal is being made available by advance subscription sale only. There are a number of different metals being offered for the subscriber to customize their choice(s). In addition to the four different "silver like" metals, to compliment the design, brass and commercial bronze are being offered as well.

The Mississauga Mint, parent company of the Lombardo Mint (www.lombardomint.com) — established since 1952 and known to many collectors for their excellent work — has been chosen to strike the medal.



OBVERSE DESIGN

It has been decided to continue to use the North York Coin Club's standard obverse design, first used on its founding medal and now an insignia of the club, appearing on its letterhead and the masthead of its monthly newsletter. The design's central element is the figure of justice as it appears on the obverse of the Lesslie twopenny piece. Two founding members of the club, John Curtis the club's first President and Ken Bunnett its second President, shared a strong interest in pre-confederation Canadian tokens, and the Lesslie twopenny is a classic in the series. The particular token from which the figure is taken is dated 1822 and features the name "Toronto" in its legend. It is hoped that the token collectors of today continue to find this to be classic image.

REVERSE DESIGN

In selecting the familiar maple wreath design, as used on the silver coinage of Canada from 1858 to 1936, we are taken back to the founding days of the North York Coin Club when the design was a familiar feature of Canada's circulating coinage. Most of North York's early members got their start in the coin hobby with the decimal coinage of Canada. The Victorian, Edward VII and George V coins bearing the maple wreath design were considered lucky finds that were quickly plucked from circulation and added to early collections. The maple wreath is both an historic and nostalgic reminder of the early '60s when coin collecting caught the imagination of the general public, and it seemed that everyone was searching for "A Fortune in Your Pocket."
