All displays by junior members will be judged separately and under one classification only (General Classification.)

Full time security will be provided by Metro Police for all displays.

During this years coin show we are featuring a refreshment table for the sale of hot and cold beverages, a supply of Numismatic materials and also a coin information centre to deal with inquiries from the general public and members alike.

PARKING FACILITIES

Ample parking area is provided at the rear of the building.

ADMISSION PRICE

The admission price will be 25 cents for adults and 10 cents for children, this admission applies to members as well as visitors to the coin show.
