A GIANT BUDDHA? Illustrated at left are the obverse and reverse of a Japanese KWAN EI TSUHO coin. The "bun" mark on the reverse indicates that it was cast in 1668 from the bronze of the Great Daibutsu, which, having stood for nearly sixty years, was toppled in an earthquake. The Daibutsu was a giant metal Buddha which was erected by the son of the shogun Tokugawa Ieyasu, in honour of his father.

with their distinctive local designs. The original Bermuda "hog money" was probably minted during the reign of King James I as a result of the re-grant of the colony to a London trading company. The Better Patent dated June 29th, 1616. It is believed to be the earliest coinage minted especially for a British colony, and its expertation from Bermuda was strictly prohibited. The coins were made of copposition plated with silver and were designed with a wild boar or hog on the one rese side, with roman numerals indicating the value and, on the reverse a ship under sail. The hog, presumably was to commemorate the boars found on the island by the shipwrecked party of Sir George Somers, and the ship his vessel. The coinage consisted of twopence, threepence, sixpence and twelvepence and none of these coins were dated. These coins are now extremely rare.
