WE ARE LOSING OUR PRESIDENT: Roger Fox has submitted his resignation as President of the North York Coin Club due to a company transfer to the city of Sudbury, Ontario. This transfer is a promotional move. The members of this club will miss Roger, but I am sure that we all wish him well in his new position. First Vice-President Stanley Clute has agreed to take over the presidency for the remainder of this year, after Roger's resignation takes effect.

LAST MEETING: The May 28 meeting of the North York Coin Club welcomed a large turnout of members and guests. President Roger Fox noted that the mint tour has been dropped, at least for the time being. Roger had contacted both the private mints in the Toronto area and both refused to hold any club tours at the present time. Bill Brennan spoke about the Ontario Agricultural College centennial dollar. Junior member Diane Getgood told members how she started collecting paper money, after last month's talk by Jack Veffer. Diane also showed some of the interesting notes she has found. Harvey Farrow spoke about the new Lawson-Bouey signatures on the \$2 and \$5 banknotes. The first featured speaker of the evening was Frank Rose, who outlined plans for the October Torex '74 show which we are participating in. The second speaker was Stan Clute, who talked about ways by which coins can be counterfeited. He also passed around some imitation ancient coins and asked the audience to identify the one genuine coin in the lot. Guest Norm Belsten guessed correctly that the genuine coin was the one which had been silvered and had two holes drilled through it. Following refreshments and the draw prizes which were won by Mr. J. A. Pratt, Mr. Walter Simpson and Tony Gordon (Tony donated his prize back, with the stipulation that it be won by a junior) and junior member Greg Anderson, Harvey Farrow conducted the auction.

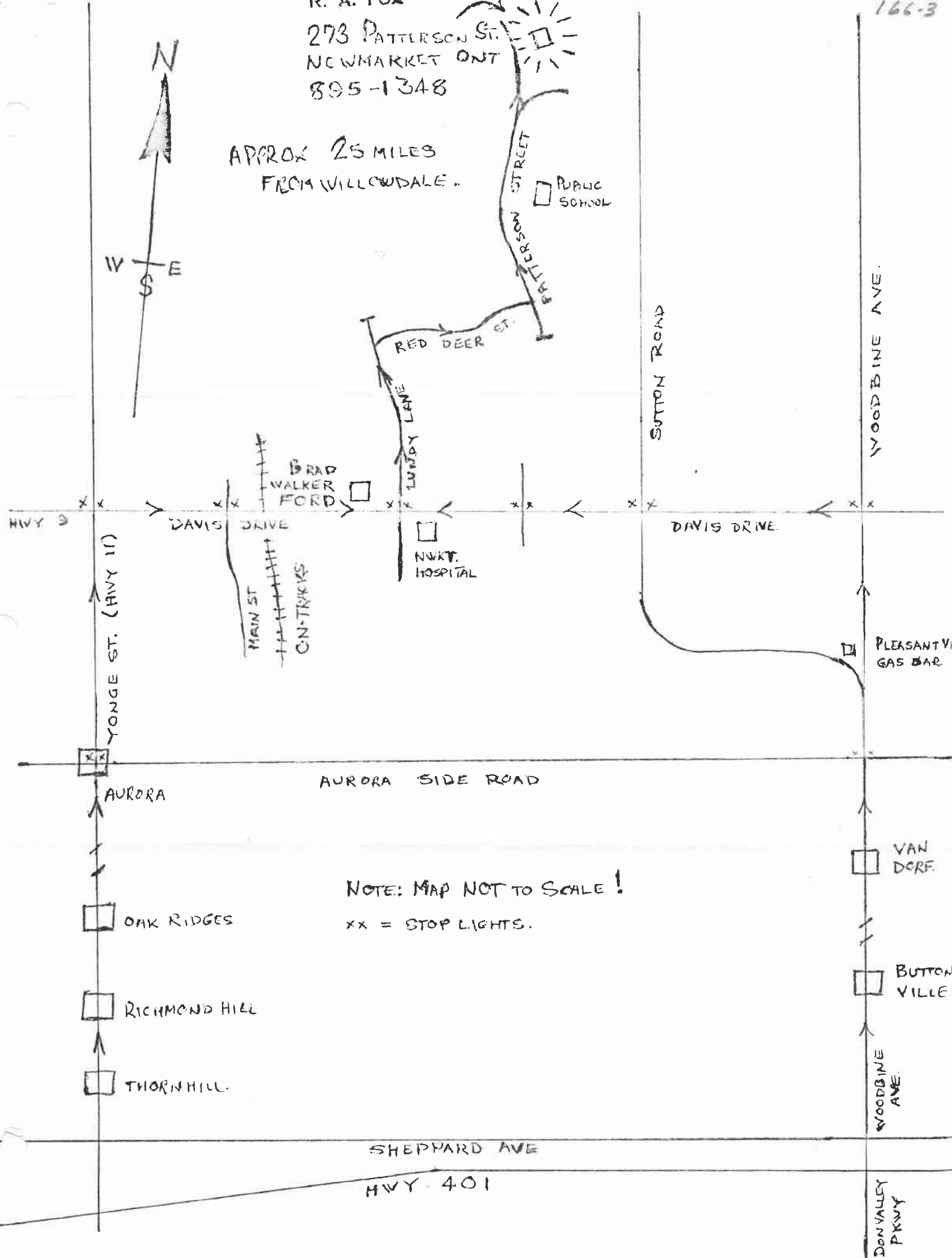
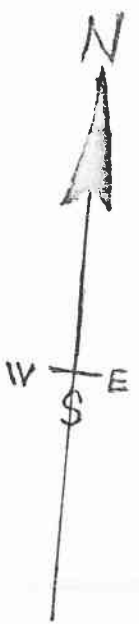

A SPECIAL OPPORTUNITY

The Olympic Committee has agreed to reserve a limited number of the \$5 and \$10 Olympic coins for registered members of Canadian recognised coin clubs, societies and associations. These are the loose, unencapsulated, uncirculated coins which were originally supposed to be available through chartered banks. The offer will include the hard-to-get first series at the issue price of \$30 plus \$3 postage and handling.

This offer is limited to one of each kind per person, regardless of how many clubs or associations he or she belongs to.

Accordingly, the Olympic Committee has asked coin clubs to send them their mailing lists in order that they may be collated and information may be sent to club members.

Your club executive has decided that the mailing addresses of members who do not wish to participate will not be released to the Olympic Coin Program. However, we also feel that members who wish to avail themselves of this offer should not be denied the opportunity.

Members who wish to have their name and mailing address released to the Olympic Coin Program in order that they may receive literature and order forms for this offer are requested to fill in the attached authorization and return it to: The Secretary, North York Coin Club, P.
