NEXT MEETING: Tuesday, May 22, will feature a set of 39 slides from the C.N.A. Library on "Seafaring". This set of slides was put out by Alex Munro a former member of the club and a Past-President of the C.N.A., The slides show the different stages of the development of shipping on coins and medals. This should be quite an interesting subject to collectors to get away from the basic collecting of Canadian decimal coinage. Starting with this meeting, the club will have in the lucky draw, a recent year, nickel, mint uncirculated set of coins for the first prize.

LAST MEETING: The "On Time Attendance Draw" the name of John Parrish was pulled and not at the meeting lost the prize of \$2.00. Harvey Farrow presented old books on Toronto History from 1897 to 1979, along with a medal put out in 1934 by the Rowntree Chocolate Company. George Fraser showed the 1984 Silver Dollar along with the \$4.00 note of the City of Toronto put out by the Canadian Paper Money Society along with old post cards and pictures of the various main intersections of the city. Marvin Kay displayed brochures and tokens for 3 medical organizations who have head offices in Toronto, namely Parkinson, Diabetic and Arthritic Societies. Wally Ciona explained how he has obtained over 100 books on Toronto, Canadian National Exhibition and the Royal Winter Fair in just over a year's time along with some medals and other interesting articles he has picked up.
