RON ZELK advised the members that in order to have accommodations, free of charge, at Edithvale Community Center, 75% of our members must live in North York. At present, about 58% are NY residents. However, as the Center is eager to have us, they have offered us 3 months rent free, on a trial basis, with hopes that we can increase our membership from the other groups that use the facilities.
