News from the May 24, 1994 Meeting

The 385th meeting of the North York Coin Club was held on Tuesday, May 24, 1994. The President, Ron Zelk, opened the meeting at 8:00 p.m., welcoming 33 members. He began by welcoming three new members: Mr. Robert Voaden of St. Catharines (#488), Mr. Ken Wilmot of Sebringville (#489) and Mr. Jean-Guy Cote of Toronto (#490). The on time attendance draw for \$2 was not won. Martin Davison was not present so the pot grows to \$4 for the June meeting. There were no juniors present to draw from the mint box.

Harvey Farrow gave a brief report on the highlights of the ONA Convention held April 22-24, 1994, mentioning that it netted out as a huge success. It is known that a profit was made and that our club's original investment in the event is secure. The final financial report will not likely be ready until the August meeting. The Chair announced that there will be a wrap-up dinner for the convention committee on Saturday, June 25, at the Yorkdale Holiday Inn.

A discussion followed which served to highlight the discrepancies between supposed versus actual grades. It enforced the fact that uniform grading is still more of an art than a science.

We thank Ted Boxall for preparing refreshments which were enjoyed by all. The break was taken prior to the evening's programme to provide time for set up.

John Regitko introduced Paul Johnson as speaker for the evening. Paul has exhibited displays with considerable success over the past 25 years and is quite knowledgeable in the "art of exhibiting". Paul distributed copies of judges' grading sheets and, using the presented categories, explained and illustrated his various helpful ideas and display techniques. All were designed to stimulate the displayers imagination into creating the desired attractive effect. He stressed the point that exhibiting is half the fun of collecting. The pride of ownership of a piece leads to research on its background in order to present an effective display and tell its story. Ron Zelk thanked Paul for sharing his valuable exhibiting experience and expressed the gratitude of the members for his time and effort in preparing the talk.

Ron then went on to thank John Regitko for the entertaining job he had done serving as master of ceremonies at the ONA Convention Banquet. John was presented with a specially engraved medal marking his contribution.

The meeting closed at 9:50 p.m.

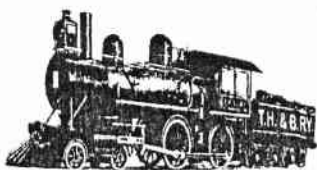
Question-of-the-Month

Our question for May asked, what are the designer names which go with the initials on our CURRENT CIRCULATING coins... reverse and obverse for one, five, ten, twenty-five, fifty cent and one dollar coins. All of the obverses are the work of Dora de Pedery-Hunt. The reverses of the 1 cent and 5 cents are by George E. Krueger-Gray, the 10 cents and 25 cents are by Emanuel Hahn, the 50 cents by Thomas Shingles and Ralph Richard Carmichael designed the loon for the \$1 coin.
